Dear Professor McCall,

We are delighted to inform you that you have been nominated for a 2019 George Mason University Adjunct Faculty Teaching Excellence Award. This award specifically recognizes an outstanding adjunct faculty member for their educational contributions to enhancing student learning at the university.

In order to be eligible for this award, you must be currently teaching a course or have taught at least one course during the past (2017-2018) academic year and also have at least six semesters of teaching experience at Mason. Semesters of teaching do not need to be consecutive to meet eligibility requirements.

Nominees who wish to be considered for this award are asked to submit a Teaching Portfolio based around a course case study, as outlined in the Portfolio Guidelines and Criteria(<http://stearnscenter.gmu.edu/wp-content/uploads/17-Adjunct-Faculty-TEA-Guidelines-Criteria-Website.pdf>). There are a number of resources at the Stearns Center that might be useful to you in your preparations. We encourage you to visit our website at stearnscenter.gmu.edu for suggestions on developing a teaching portfolio. If you meet our eligibility requirements and wish to proceed with your nomination, please email stearns@gmu.edu by January 16, 2019, to confirm your intent.

We have uploaded a small sample of teaching portfolios available for your perusal online at <https://goo.gl/qJaNzE>. Of course, Stearns Center staff would be happy to talk with you as you develop your submission materials. This year, we are also offering a limited number of 30-minute Portfolio Consultations with one of our previous award winners in January and February; more information and a link to a sign-up schedule will be sent in January.

Please keep in mind that your submissions will be read by faculty from a variety of disciplines, so be sure that your language and descriptions are written with non-specialists in mind.

If you prefer to submit a paper portfolio, binders for your portfolio will be provided—please indicate a campus mail stop at which to deliver, or stop by the Stearns Center (Innovation Hall 412) any time after January 9 for pick-up. We also will be using your official Mason email address for communication throughout the selection process—please be sure to check it regularly.
